Recommended language skills

There are no specific language requirements for studying at the University of Bologna (except for medical and nursing students). However, before starting the mobility the student is strongly advised to have at least basic knowledge of Italian (level A2) and a B1/B2 level of English in order to be able to study and make the most of the lectures. The University of Bologna does not require any official language certificate.

Learning Italian

The student can sit the [Italian Orienting Test](#) in order to assess the knowledge of Italian. The student can also attend a MOOC. Erasmus+ students can benefit from the [Online Linguistic Support – OLS](#) provided by their home universities as well.

In the first and second semester, the University Language Centre runs Italian language courses for international students. Exchange students can attend one course free of charge. The courses are held both in the first and second semester, during September-December and February-June. The sending institution, following agreement with the receiving institution, is responsible for providing support to its nominated candidates so that they can have the recommended language skills at the start of the mobility period.

Additional requirements

Exchange students will normally be permitted to enter courses at I BOLOGNA01 unless these courses are subject to restricted enrolments. The students must choose course units of the subject area under which they were nominated by home university and must have a Learning Agreement consistent with it. In order to check the availability of courses they would like to attend, they must contact the [International Relations Office](#) of their study field.

Nominations

The University of Bologna implemented an **online nomination tool**. Partners will receive the customized link and the instructions via email yearly.

Student nominations and applications must reach I BOLOGNA01 by:

1 July	1 December	There is no deadlines. Students must register on our platform after receiving the acceptance message and submit their learning agreement before their mobility starts.	

The study field of the Erasmus Agreement is binding: please nominate students attending a study program which is coherent with the study field of the bilateral agreement.

The bilateral agreement specifies the number of places available. It is not possible to split the duration of each mobility to increase the number of exchanges (for example, if an agreement foresees 2 students for 10 months, it is not possible to nominate 4 students for 5 months).

The University of Bologna is organized on a multi-campus structure. Courses and research activities are held in five cities: Bologna (the main campus), Cesena, Forlì, Ravenna and Rimini. Students need to pay attention to the campus which they have been nominated for, since Campus changes will be only exceptionally allowed, and only for verified academic needs.

The four cities are well connected to Bologna by train, but we warmly recommend students to find accommodation in the city where their campus is located.

The University of Bologna does not require a mandatory number of ECTS for each term.

Start/end date of the mobility

There are no set start/end dates. The students can decide when to leave for the University of Bologna (in case of physical mobility) according to the starting date of their courses. Each Degree Programme has its own course and exam timetable.

In general, the calendar is as follows:

- **Fall semester:** September 20th – November 30th (classes) / January 7th – January 31st (exams)
- **Spring semester:** February 1st – May 31st (classes) / June 1st – July 31st (exams)

The course timetables are set yearly, just before the start of the programmes and they are published in the [course units](#) pages starting from July.

The start date of physical mobility period corresponds to the date of check-in at the Exchange Student Desk (or at the International Office of the Campus); the start date of virtual mobility is registered via an online check-in according to the instructions available on our website.
